

On October 13th, the village of Pense was notified about the demolition of our elevator. Last month we spotlighted '*Elevator Row*' and reminisced on the history of the buildings that have stood there in the past. This month we continue the story discussing the years during and after the big move to the location our elevator stands today. We brought in an expert to help us reflect—Colin Gottselig.

We moved to Pense in March of 1981 – Lori and I were away on our honey moon in Hawaii and when we got home I had a few phone calls from the Regional Manager requesting that I get in touch with him. He informed me that I had my choice of a position up north as Assistant Manager or the same in Pense. It was a no brainer for me as I was helping my Dad and Brother on the farm so this would work out great. I accepted the job and never looked back, turned out to be a great decision.

I started here with Jim Quigley the Manager and worked with him till late spring of 1982 when Jim moved to Morse and Wilf Ludwar moved here from Fronteir. During this period we were running 3 elevators with the main elevator built in 1967 and an old Federal to the west and another old plant on the other side to the east. We bought and shipped grain out of all 3 plants but mostly the main plant. There was getting to be a lot of talk of getting work done to the main plant to give it more storage and then the idea to move it down the tracks to give us a 25 car spot up from 8. The Pense Pool committee backed by farmers in the area and the Sask. Wheat Pool Management to get this idea down on paper and set it in motion. It was decided to be done and in 1984 things began to happen with the removal of some old storage attached to the big elevator and then the work started on preparing the elevator for the move. I took awhile to get everything done and

ready for the move but it happened and then finally we were in the new plant as it stands today with 100,000 bushel more storage, 2 legs and overhead scale to make the grain move so much faster. It was incredible. This was a huge jump in production for us and our farmers. We could load a 3,300 bushel car in 20 minuets. We would buy grain and load 25 cars in one day and end up full again at the end of the day. The day they moved the elevator they let the kids out of school to watch because it was a big part of Pense History. There were lots of cameras. Some big accomplishments during the time at the Pense elevator were as follows:

- 1] We reached the 1 Million Bushel mark a few times during Wilf and My time here.
- 2] We reached the 2 Million Bushel mark one year and were the second highest handler in the wood crib elevators. The cement plants were coming into service then.
- 3] We also reached 1 Million dollars in Farm Supply sales one year which was huge for getting it while only having 3 fertilizer bins and a 12 X 30 chemical shed. It was a very big accomplishment and could not have been done without the farmers taking a lot of products right off the truck on their farms.
- 4] Our area of elevators were: Rowatt, Tregarva, Bethune and Pense and we won leather jackets for everyone because we used the elevators in our area to move different grains for our farmers. This would include small amounts of grain a producer has left but we did not want to tie up a large bin for a few hundred bushels or some specialty crops that moved better out of another elevator. We handled Malt Barley in our plant and took that from another plant so it was handled correctly. Just a couple of examples. We had to send a letter in stating the things we did and for what producers and what elevators were involved. We were the winners the first year of the program out of all the elevators and areas of the province. The jackets were very nice.

We were staffed with Wilf, myself and a helper some of the time as he was always moving to other plants to help out. There was a lot of work for 2 guys but finally got to the point that the helper was there most of the time. Wilf and I worked well together and did our best to help our farmers out when ever we could with grain movement and farm supplies. We handled Durum and readers might be interested that for years all the Prairie Made Puffed came from SWP Pense Elevator and the farmers. We had the nicest durum according to Prairie Puffed Wheat. We also bought red spring wheat, Malt Barley, Feed Barley, Flax, Rye, Sunflower Seeds, Peas, Feed Lentils and Canola.

We handled all kinds of chemicals for crops as well as fertilize, seed treatments, seed, grain bins and Quonsets.


The farmers were our customers and we did what ever we could to help them achieve their goals and beyond. We had a great bunch of guys in our area and enjoyed working with them. I miss the time discussing farm practise and new ideas as well as crops.

We also supplied a Valmar to put product down as well as a fertilizer spreader for customers to use for applying the fertilizer they bought from us. It was quite a challenge to keep track of the spreader some days and I could tell you some stories that would make you laugh but we will leave that for another time. LOL

I miss working with the guys I worked with as we had good working relationship. We will always have the memories of the times we had as well as the laughs and great times.

The Saskatchewan Wheat Pool Committee at Pense was instrumental in getting the elevator moved and upgraded to handle and move the amount of grains that were grown in this area. They always were involved in the elevator and what was needed and things we could do to move things along better. We had a number of different committee members over the years and I will list some the I remember and sorry if I missed anyone.

Some I remember are: Terry Anderson, Dick Baker, Harvey Brentnell, Wes Brunskill, Bob Dunlop, Glen Good, Ed Hunt, Jake Krahn, Bill Lax, Bud Spearing, Lorne Straub, Dave Tanner, Mike Tutkaluk, and Simon Vanderstoel.



Being close to Regina and Head Office we had a lot of tours of the plant here. It seemed Wilf would find things to do on the days these were scheduled to happen. He said I did a better job at it which to this day I am not sure if that was true. LOL We met a lot of interesting people from all over Canada and the world. They were very interested in the handling of grain and payment for it. They loved all the different kinds of crops we handled and where they went. Always lots of pictures taken by them. They were also very interested in the farming techniques we used here. It was educational for all involved.

The Elevator closed in January 2001 for local farmers. At the time of closure Wilf Ludwar was the Manager, I was off on disability and Ron Schnieder was helping out. The plant has been used since that time a a storage and some shipping of Mustard.

Wilf and I agree that Pense was one of the best communities to work in and live.

If the elevator is demolished it will be a loss for this community and area, there are getting to be fewer of these prairie giants standing guard over towns on the prairies.




